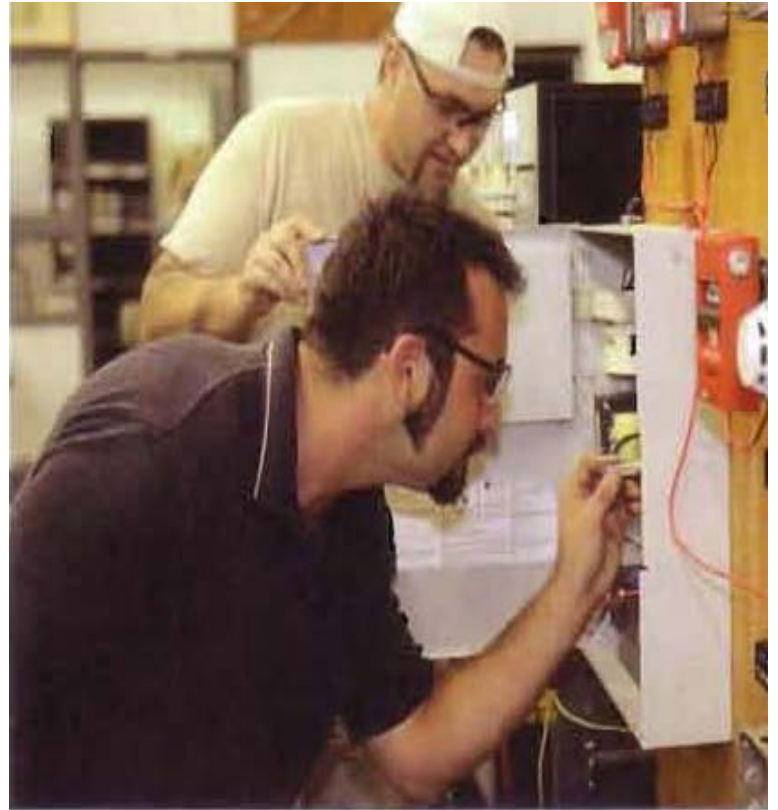
## Basic Electronics Certificate Program

**Basic Electronics Certificate** program prepares students for an entry-level position in the field of electronics by providing a basic understanding of concepts, terminology and common tools and instruments used in electronics. The program features a balance between theory and practical applications through both computer simulation and real world circuitry.

The Basic Electronics program provides the opportunity for national certification in electronic fabrication and soldering of electronic circuits. Students will acquire skills in:

- using multimeters, oscilloscopes, power supplies and signal generators for testing and troubleshooting
- thorough-hole and surface mount soldering and assembly
- using electronic software, such as circuits and system simulation
- electronic measurement, circuits, and microcontrollers, and
- transistor and integrated circuit electronics

Upon completion of this program, graduates may seek employment in the areas of technical sales or component and unit testing with titles such as assembler, technician or engineering assistant.
